

INDIA to UAE

Conditions / Requirement

1. UAE National or Resident with valid visa will be permitted on the repatriation flights.
2. Indian national holding Tourist/Visit or any type of valid UAE visa will be permitted to travel from India on the above mentioned flights.
3. Passengers holding Resident visas issued from AUH & AAN, to check the visa status on uaeentry.ica.gov.ae and it should show "GREEN SIGNAL" before issuance of ticket.
4. All other emirates, ICA approval is not required till further notice.
5. Approvals can be obtained via https://smart.gdrfad.gov.ae/Smart_OTCServicesPortal/ReturnPermitService.aspx.
(Please also note, a rejected application will need another 5 days before reapplying again)
6. For Residence VISAs issued outside Dubai, you will need to confirm your entry/re-entry to the UAE at uaeentry.ica.gov.ae before booking your flight. If you do not confirm your entry/re-entry to the UAE, you will not be accepted for travel.
7. PCR test negative result report issued within 96hrs of departure from ICMR laboratories.
8. Please be informed that effective 27th Sep, PCR test reports (within 96 hours of travel) will be accepted from "UAE approved laboratories" only for travel ex **DEL & LKO to Dubai**. [Click here](#) to find the details of the UAE approved Laboratories across India. Passengers holding PCR test reports from any other laboratory will not be allowed to travel.
9. For travel from the rest of India to Dubai, PCR test reports (within 96 hours of travel) from any of the ICMR approved labs will be accepted.
10. Please carry two copies of the C3 Health Declaration Form ([click here](#)), COVID 19 undertaking ([click here](#)) and APHO declaration form ([click here](#)) duly filled along with a valid/adequate health Insurance for UAE
11. On arrival before leaving the airport passenger must download the COVID19-DXB Smart app to register with the Dubai Health authority.

14. With immediate effect passengers travelling to Dubai on tourist / visit visa or planning to obtain "Visa on Arrival" are mandatorily required to be in possession of a valid return ticket. In the absence of having a valid return ticket, the passengers will be denied entry in Dubai and shall be deported at their own cost and expenses.

Expired UAE Resident Visas:

- 1. Before the 1" March 20 are not permitted,**
- 2. After 1" March 20 are permitted to travel**
- 3. Stayed more than 180 days outside the country are permitted to travel**

PCR Test result to be in English or Arabic only (if in Arabic, need to be supported along with English Translation). Passengers need to Carry printed copy of COVID-19 PCR test result to the Airport . Soft copies on mobiles will not be acceptable.

Passengers need to carry all the documents at the time of Travel.

All passengers are required to check the UAE Government Authority Website for the latest updates on travel.

This step has been necessitated due to the high number of fake certificates and improperly tested passengers who have reported to the airport or have been detected COVID positive at Dubai. To ensure that your passengers are accepted, please note they must have their PCR Tests done at the above facilities only and carry certificates from these labs only. The rate for testing are the same as that which is approved by the Government of India for COVID-19 PCR Testing.

Passengers holding PCR test reports from any other laboratory will not be accepted from 04SEP20 onwards.

Passengers need to report to these centers with their ticket numbers at least 20hrs before departure in case of Lucknow, and 18hrs in case of Delhi. A copy of report will be sent by the laboratory directly to us confirming the passenger's status for acceptance. A copy will also given to the passenger.

Important Update for Passenger travelling to Dubai: (from 23rd October 2020)

This is to inform you that as per Dubai Civil Authorities, the RT-PCR Test done by the following laboratories shall not be accepted for passengers travelling to Dubai:

Passengers are advised to get their RT-PCR tests done from laboratories approved by Pure Health only to ensure a seamless travel experience. To view the list of approved labs, visit <https://screening.purehealth.ae/application>.

Conditions / Requirement for travel effective 2nd Feb 2021

With immediate effect, Ok To Board (OKTB) is not required for passengers travelling from Hyderabad, Cochin & Calicut to Dubai till further notice.

All other travel conditions remain unchanged.

Conditions / Requirement for travel effective 22nd April 2021

Kindly note, effective 22nd April 2021 all passengers travelling from any point in India to Dubai are requested to carry a Negative RT-PCR report with mandatory QR code which is linked to the original report.

Passengers will not be allowed to travel without QR code shown on the RT-PCR report.

(VALID Covid-19 Test certificate should indicate NEGATIVE that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, 48 hours from the time of collecting the sample and also ensure that the time of sample collection - "Date & Time" and time of reporting "Result date and Result time" are accurate.)

To/From UAE

Conditions / Requirement effective 31st January 2021

UAE residents, GCC citizens & tourists arriving & transiting to/from Dubai (DXB)

All UAE residents, GCC citizens, and visitors traveling to Dubai need to hold a printed negative COVID-19 PCR certificate. The test should be taken no more than 72 hours prior to the departure of the inbound flight to Dubai (DXB). This does not apply to Children under 12 and passengers with moderate to severe disabilities.

All transiting passengers arriving from the below listed countries are required to present a printed negative COVID-19 PCR certificate. The test should be taken no more than 72 hours prior to the departure of your inbound flight to Dubai (DXB). If the validity period of the test result is different in the country the passenger is departing from or travelling to, the most restrictive validity period should be followed -

Passengers travelling from one of the Countries listed below, a second PCR test will be taken upon arrival in Dubai and passengers will need to quarantine until the test results are received:

Afghanistan, Angola, Argentina, Bangladesh, Brazil, Cambodia, Chile, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Djibouti, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Georgia, Ghana, Guinea, Hungary, Indonesia, India, Iran, Iraq, Israel, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Kenya, Lebanon, Malta, Moldova, Montenegro, Morocco, Myanmar, Nigeria, Nepal, Pakistan, the Philippines, Romania, the Russian Federation, Rwanda, Senegal, Slovakia, Somaliland, South Africa, South Sudan, Sudan, Syria, Tajikistan, Tanzania, Tunisia, Turkmenistan, Uganda, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Vietnam, Zambia or Zimbabwe.

UAE Nationals from all countries arriving to Dubai (DXB) - All UAE Nationals are Not required to conduct PCR test before arriving at Dubai (DXB). A PCR Test will be taken on arrival only.

Passengers should download the “COVID 19 DXB Smart” App before arriving at Dubai (DXB).
