Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Dubai as of 9th August, 2021

Customers travelling from India to Dubai must take note of the following mandates.

Only the following categories of customers will be allowed entry to Dubai:

- Valid UAE resident visa holders.
- Members of the medical force/staff, including doctors, nurses and medical technicians.
- Staff/employees of the educational sector, including professors and teachers, those who teach at universities, colleges, schools and institutions in the UAE.
- Students who are currently studying in the UAE.
- Those holding a valid visa, on humanitarian grounds and, i.e., cases of family reunion.
- Diplomatic personnel between UAE and applicable countries, Employees/staff of local and federal government entities.
- Those who are undergoing medical treatments in UAE.
- UAE residents with golden or silver residency permits.
- Expo 2020 international participants, exhibitors and personnel, sponsored by Expo 2020 organisers.
- Customers must carry a negative RT-PCR certificate in printed form, from a government-approved laboratory in India (ICMR) or a certified designated laboratory available on <https://www.icmr.gov.in/> issued no more than 48 hr before departure of the last direct flight to Dubai. The certificate issued shall be duly signed and stamped by relevant authorities and must only be in English or Arabic. Handwritten certificates shall not be permitted. 48 hr is calculated from the time of sample collection.
- The negative RT-PCR certificate held by the customer must have a QR code linking it to their original test report. It must have the date and time of sample collection, and the test result mentioned accurately.
- Customers holding a negative RT-PCR certificate without a QR code shall be denied boarding at the origin station.

Note: Children under 12 years of age are exempted from pre-RT-PCR test.

- Customers are also mandatorily required to undergo a rapid RT-PCR test at least 4 hr before departure at the airport.
- All UAE residents who have Dubai issued residence visas must obtain GDRFA approval before travelling through https://smart.gdrfad.gov.ae/Smart_OTCServicesPortal/ReturnPermitService.aspx. The approval should be issued on or after 05th August 2021.
- All customers transiting Dubai, must carry a negative PCR certificate in printed form, from a government- approved laboratory in India (ICMR) or a certified designated laboratory which is available on <https://www.icmr.gov.in/> issued no more than 72 hr before departure of the last direct flight to Dubai or less as per the requirements of the final destination. The certificate issued shall be duly signed and stamped by relevant authorities and must only be in English or Arabic. Handwritten certificates shall not be permitted. 72 hr is calculated from the time of sample collection.
- The negative PCR certificate held by the customer must have a QR code on it linking it to their original test report and must have the date and time of sample collection, and the test result mentioned accurately. Customers holding a negative PCR certificate without a QR code shall be denied boarding at the origin station.

Note: Children under 12 years are exempted from pre-RT-PCR test.

- All customers must download the COVID-19 Dubai Smart app and generate a QR code on their device before entering Dubai.

Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Abu Dhabi as of 9th August, 2021

Customers travelling from India to Abu Dhabi must take note of the following mandates.

Only the following categories of customers will be allowed entry to Abu Dhabi:

- Valid UAE resident visa holders who have obtained the required vaccination doses in the UAE and completed 14 days and hold a vaccination card issued from a medical institution in the UAE, including the vaccine certificate available in the smart application(s) of Government Medical entities in the UAE.
- Members of the medical force/staff, including doctors, nurses and medical technicians, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.
- Staff/employees of the educational sector, including Professors and teachers, those who teach at universities, colleges, schools and institutions in the UAE, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.
- Students who are currently studying in the UAE, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.
- Those holding a valid visa, on humanitarian grounds and/or, i.e., family reunion cases, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.

- Members of the medical force/staff, including doctors, nurses and medical technicians, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.
- Staff/employees of the educational sector, including professors and teachers, those who teach at universities, colleges, schools and institutions in the UAE, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.
- Students who are currently studying in the UAE, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.

- Those holding a valid visa, on humanitarian grounds and/or, i.e., cases of family reunion, whether Employees/staff of local and federal government entities, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated

The certificate

issued shall be duly signed and stamped by relevant authorities and must only be in English or Arabic. Handwritten certificates shall not be permitted. 72 hr is calculated from the time of sample collection.

- Valid UAE resident visa holders who have obtained the required vaccination doses in the UAE and completed 14 days and hold a vaccination card issued from a medical institution in the UAE, including the vaccine certificate available in the smart application(s) of government medical entities in the UAE.
- Members of the medical force/staff, including doctors, nurses and medical technicians, whether vaccinated or not vaccinated.

All customers transiting Sharjah must carry a negative RT-PCR certificate in printed form, from a government-approved laboratory in India (ICMR) or a certified designated laboratory which is available on <https://www.icmr.gov.in/issued> no more than 72 hr before departure of the last direct flight to Dubai or less as per the requirements of the final destination. The certificate issued shall be duly signed and stamped by relevant authorities and must only be in English or Arabic. Handwritten certificates shall not be permitted. 72 hr is calculated from the time of sample collection.

The negative RT-PCR certificate held by the customer must have a QR code linking it to their original test report and must have the date and time of sample collection and the test result mentioned accurately. All customers must download and register on the ALHOSN app. We request you to inform our customers of these mandates so they may have a hassle-free journey.

Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Abu Dhabi

1. UAE nationals and residents are allowed to travel to AUH
2. UAE residents are to required upload their data- ID number, passport, and nationality - on the <https://uaeentry.ica.gov.ae> link to verify the authenticity of their travel documents.
3. Customers must carry a negative **PCR** certificate in printed form, from a government-approved laboratory in India (**ICMR**) or a Certified designated laboratory, issued no more than **96 hours** before departure
 - a. Note: Children under 12 years are exempted from Pre-COVID test
4. Residents must undergo a PCR test upon arrival into Abu Dhabi as well
5. Transit/transfer beyond UAE will not be permitted
6. All passengers must agree to undergo 14-day home quarantine
7. All passengers must fill a health declaration form and submit it at the Immigration counter on arrival
8. All passengers must download and register on the **ALHOSN** app.

Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Dubai

1. UAE nationals, residents, others holding any type of visa or seeking visa on arrival are allowed to travel
2. UAE residents who have Dubai issued residence visa need to obtain GDRFA approval before travelling
3. UAE residents holding residence visa issued through any other Emirate are not required to obtain an ICA approval however are required to register on [https://uaeentry.ica.gov.ae/](https://uaeentry.ica.gov.ae) before travelling

4. Customers must carry a negative PCR certificate in printed form, from a government-approved laboratory in India (ICMR) or a Certified designated laboratory, issued no more than 96 hours before departure
 - a. Note: Children under 12 years are exempted from Pre-COVID test
5. All customers must undergo a PCR test upon arrival into Dubai as well
6. All passengers must complete a health declaration and quarantine undertaking form provided at the boarding gate and submit the same upon arrival in Dubai to IndiGo staff and the DHA desk respectively.
7. All passengers must download the COVID-19 – DXB smart app on their device.
8. Transit/transfer beyond UAE will not be permitted.
9. With immediate effect passengers travelling to Dubai on tourist / visit visa or planning to obtain "**Visa on Arrival**" are mandatorily required to be in possession of a valid return ticket. In the absence of having a valid return ticket, the passengers will be denied entry in Dubai and shall be deported at their own cost and expenses.

Important Update for Passenger travelling to Dubai: (till 22nd October 2020)

Please note that as per Dubai Civil Authorities the RT-PCR Test done by the following laboratories shall not be accepted for passengers travelling to Dubai.

Important Update for Passenger travelling to Dubai: (from 23rd October 2020)

Passengers are advised to get their RT-PCR tests done from laboratories approved by Pure Health only to ensure a seamless travel experience. To view the list of approved labs, visit <https://screening.purehealth.ae/application>.

Conditions / Requirement for travel effective 22nd April 2021

Kindly note, effective 22nd April 2021 all passengers travelling from any point in India to Dubai are requested to carry a Negative RT-PCR report with mandatory QR code which is linked to the original report.

Passengers will not be allowed to travel without QR code shown on the RT-PCR report.

(VALID Covid-19 Test certificate should indicate NEGATIVE that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, 48 hours from the time of collecting the sample and also ensure that the time of sample collection - "Date & Time" and time of reporting "Result date and Result time" are accurate.)

Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Sharjah

1. UAE nationals, residents and others holding any type of visa are allowed to travel
2. UAE residents are to required upload their data- ID number, passport, and nationality - on the <https://uaentry.ica.gov.ae> link to verify the authenticity of their travel documents.
3. Visa on arrival is not available and customers seeking the same are not allowed to travel
4. Customers must carry a negative **PCR** certificate in printed form, from a government-approved laboratory in India (**ICMR**) or a Certified designated laboratory, issued no more than **48 hours** before departure
 - a. Note: Children under 12 years are exempted from Pre-COVID test
5. All customers must undergo a PCR test upon arrival into Sharjah as well
6. Transit/transfer beyond UAE will not be permitted
7. All customers must undergo 14-day home quarantine if the stay is in Sharjah.
 - a. If proceeding to Dubai upon landing into Sharjah, then quarantine rules of Dubai will be applicable
8. All passengers must fill a health declaration and quarantine undertaking form and submit it at the Immigration counter on arrival.
9. All passengers must download and register on the **ALHOSN** app

Conditions / Requirement for passengers to Sharjah (24th Sep 2020)

As per the directives issued by Government of Sharjah, the revised travel guidelines and procedures are as below:

1. All UAE residents, GCC nationals, and those carrying nationalities eligible for visa on arrival are welcome to fly through Sharjah airport.
2. UAE residents do not need prior approval to enter Sharjah.
3. It is mandatory to have a negative COVID-14 test report, issued not more than 96 hours before arriving into Sharjah.
4. Upon arriving at Sharjah airport, another PCR test will be conducted. Passengers should stay self-quarantined until COVID-19 test results are notified.
5. No quarantine is required for passengers with a negative test result.
6. Passengers with positive results must quarantine for 14 days, one bear all treatment expenses.
7. Visitors and Tourists are required to have International health Insurance.
8. With immediate effect passengers holding residence visa from Al Ain and Abu Dhabi need to have ICA approval before arriving in Sharjah.

Conditions / Requirement for travel effective 22nd April 2021

Kindly note, effective 22nd April 2021 all passengers travelling from any point in India to Dubai are requested to carry a Negative RT-PCR report with mandatory QR code which is linked to the original report.

Passengers will not be allowed to travel without QR code shown on the RT-PCR report.

(VALID Covid-19 Test certificate should indicate NEGATIVE that is issued within the valid time frame, namely, 48 hours from the time of collecting the sample and also ensure that the time of sample collection - "Date & Time" and time of reporting "Result date and Result time" are accurate.)

UAE to INDIA

Conditions / Requirement

1. Have a valid **ICA / GDRFA** General Directorate of Residency and Foreign Affairs approval.
2. Passengers are required to carry **COVID-19 negative test result** of the PCR test conducted not more than 96 hours before departure.
3. Download the COVID-19 - **Arogya Setu app, ALHOSN & DXB Smart App.**

Important travel guidelines for passengers travelling to India

1. All passengers must undergo mandatory 7-day self-paid institutional as well as 7-day home quarantine, while agreeing to bear the complete expenses of their institutional quarantine.
2. All passengers must submit a self-declaration form on www.newdelhairport.in and declare their consent for self-paid institutional quarantine.
3. Any passenger arriving into India and seeking exemption from institutional quarantine may apply for the same on the central website www.newdelhairport.in 72 hr before departure if they fall under any of the following five categories
 - A. Expectant mothers
 - B. Passengers with kids under 10 years of age
 - C. Patient requiring immediate medical care
 - D. Passenger with a death in the family
 - E. Passengers with COVID-negative certificate (RT-PCR) issued within 96 hrs the departure
4. As per Government of India's guidelines, international passengers arriving into India are permitted to take onward flights only after they have completed mandatory quarantine at the first port of entry into India or are exempted from being quarantined.
5. Please check more detailed guidelines issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare and MHA.
6. All passengers must fill the online health declaration form under COVID updates (**Air Suvudha**) on the link <https://www.newdelhairport.in/airsuvudha/apho-registration> at least 72 hours before the scheduled arrival in India. Passengers will receive an approval code that must be presented at the Arrival Health Counter.

 - a. Note: Applications are being accepted on behalf of the State Government and the Form needs to be applied at least 72 hours prior to flying.
8. All passengers are requested to check the Country/State website before travel.

Important travel guidelines for passengers travelling to India effective 22th Feb 2021

- All passengers shall be mandatorily required to submit self health declaration form on Air Suvudha Portal All passengers shall be mandatorily required to upload COVID-19 negative RT-PCR on Air Suvudha Portal.
- Test should have been taken within 72 hours of the departure All passengers are required to submit online decoration with respect to authenticity of the report and to abide by the decision of the government authority to undergo home quarantine/self-health monitoring for 14 days or as warranted
- Exemption from RT-PCR requirement shall be permitted only in case of death in the family and must be applied online at least 72 hours before departure on the Air Suvudha Portal.

- All passengers shall be required to present online SDF/RT-PCR exemption approval to the health authorities upon arrival.
- All passengers shall be required to be in possession of physical or digital copy of the acknowledgement of their self health declaration form submitted on the Air Suvidha Portal along with their RT-PCR report failing which they can be denied boarding at the origin station.
- Passengers shall be required to download the Aarogya Setu App before or upon arrival into India.
- Passengers originating or transiting through United Kingdom, Europe or Middle East shall adhere to below in addition to the above
 - Undergo molecular test upon arrival at their own cost and proceed towards home quarantine/self health monitoring or take onward connecting flights to final destination within India.
- In addition to the above, passengers originating from United Kingdom, South Africa or Brazil shall adhere to below in addition to the above
 - In case the customer's journey ends at first port of entry into India, inform them to undergo molecular test upon arrival at their own cost and proceed towards home quarantine/self health monitoring. They are not required to wait for test results.
 - In case of onward connection, passengers shall have to wait for the RT-PCR test results. Onward journey shall be permitted only if the test result is negative

Failure to comply with the above guidelines may lead to denied boarding.
