

INDIA to KUWAIT

Conditions / Requirement

Passengers who have been in or transited through Afghanistan, Argentina, Armenia, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, Chile, China (People's Rep.), Colombia, Dominican Rep., Egypt, France, Hong Kong (SAR China), India, Indonesia, Iran, Iraq, Italy, Kosovo (Rep.), Lebanon, Mexico, Moldova (Rep.), Montenegro, Nepal, North Macedonia (Rep.), Panama, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Serbia, Spain, Sri Lanka, Syria or Yemen in the past 14 days are not allowed to enter.

This does not apply to:

- nationals of Kuwait;
- children, husbands and wives of nationals of Kuwait;
- passengers with proof of being domestic employees of residents of Kuwait arriving directly from Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Philippines or Sri Lanka on Kuwait Airways (KU) or Jazeera Airways (J9);
- passengers with a diplomatic or special passport. They must have prior approval from the Embassy of Kuwait.

Suspension of visa on arrival facilities.

Passengers with a residence permit issued by Kuwait are allowed to enter with a Digital Civil ID issued via the 'Kuwait Mobile ID' app.

Residents of Kuwait who left Kuwait before 1 September 2019 are not allowed to enter Kuwait.

Quarantine:

Passengers are subject to medical screening and self-isolation for 14 days.

Negative Covid-19 test result:

Passengers must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) PCR test result. The test must have been taken at most 96 hours before departure.

This does not apply to:

- passengers younger than 6 years;
- passengers returning to Kuwait with a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) PCR test result issued before departure from Kuwait. They must have been a maximum of 4 days abroad.

Forms or applications:

Passengers should install "Shlonik" and "Kuwait-Mosafer" applications on their personal device.

Nationals of GCC countries are not allowed to enter with a Civil ID card.

- This does not apply to nationals of Kuwait with a Civil ID card if they used the card when they departed from Kuwait.

Conditions / Requirement for travel effective 7th Feb 2021

As per the directives from authorities Circular No (2021/07) dated 04/02/2021 for inbound travelers to Kuwait from 7th Feb 2021 being limited to the below customers only,

- Kuwaiti Nationals only.
- Non-Kuwaiti first Degree relative of Kuwaiti nationals. - Domestic helpers travelling with Kuwaiti sponsors.
- Domestic workers registered on the ([Belsalamah.com](https://belsalamah.com)) platform.

KUWAIT to INDIA

Conditions / Requirement

Flights to India are suspended until 31 December 2020. This does not apply to relief, repatriation and humanitarian flights.

Passengers are not allowed to enter.

This does not apply to:

- Nationals of India;
- Residents of India;
- Nationals of Nepal and Bhutan;
- Passengers with an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card or booklet;
- Students if one of the parents is a national of India or an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holder;
- Minors if one of the parents is a national of India or an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holder;
- Spouses of nationals of India;
- Single parents of a minor who is national of India or an Overseas Citizen of India (OCI) card holder;
- Passengers with a Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) card;
- Passengers with a visa (excluding medical visas issued on or before October 21, 2020, and Tourist visas) issued by India;
- Passengers returning from a neighboring country via India to their country of residence.

E-visas, Medical visas, and Tourist Visas are no longer valid.

Medical visas issued on or before 21 October 2020 are no longer valid.

Connecting Flight information

Passengers are not allowed to transit through Delhi (DEL) or Mumbai (BOM).

Non-US citizens must fly directly from India to the United States as transiting through the European Union or United Kingdom is not permitted at this time.

Quarantine:

Passengers without a printed medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) RT-PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before departure are subject to quarantine for 14 days.

Negative COVID-19 test result:

Passengers without a printed medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (COVID-19) RT-PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before departure are subject to quarantine for 14 days.

Passengers arriving in India are subject to medical screening.

Forms or applications:

Passengers travelling to India must install "Arogya Setu" in their personal device; and must present a completed Self-reporting form obtained at <https://www.newdelhairport.in/covid19>.
